| Lakeview Elementary School Garden | 3500 Queen St., Grow Regina community gardens | http://lakeview.rbe.sk.ca/ | Lakeview School tends a rented garden plot located at Grow Regina Community Gardens. The grade 1-2 class are the primary users, but other community members, teachers and students help out as well. They use the produce as part of the school's snack program, for kids cooking programs, they send some home with students, parents and volunteers, and donate some to the food bank, soup kitchen and homeless shelter. |

| Miller Comprehensive High School Garden | 1027 College Ave | www.rcsd.ca/miller/ | Miller High School is starting their first year for their school garden (Spring 2016), which has transformed a once concrete wasteland into a beautiful, edible learning space. Students are starting seedlings indoors and then transplanting them into raised beds and containers outdoors. They also have fruit shrubs, native prairie plants and pollinator attractors planted into the existing soil. They are partnering with others in the community to help tend over the summer months. |
| Prairie Sky School Native Plant Garden | 3233 Argyle Rd | www.prairieskyschool.net | At Prairie Sky School they have several small raised beds, flower beds, a Three Sisters Garden, a Sunflower House and Little Green Thumbs indoor garden through the winter. Prairie Sky School teaches the Saskatchewan Curriculum through Art, Community and Nature, and so the garden plays a significant role in their programing and hands-on learning. |
| Saint Dominic Savio Elementary | 195 Windfield Rd | http://www.rcsd.ca/?q=node/151 | St Dominic Savio Grade 5-6 class does indoor container gardening every year to get kids excited about healthy eating, for interdisciplinary learning opportunities and to teach kids to be able to grow their own food. They use the produce as part of their snack program. |
